Why procurement?

- ★ During the COVID-19 crisis: from whom is your government
- buying? For how much? At which price?
- ★ Afterwards: what will happen with vaccines/treatments?
- ★ Oppose traditional opacity on Pharma industry.
- 🖈 You can investigate medicines, but also equipments,
- concessions for hospitals...
- ★ Apply your knowledge to investigate new topics. Everything
- has some public procurement on it.
- \star It's so easy to make mistakes.



Study and understand the law.

Main concepts

- ★ Tender portal. Find your(s).
- ★ Open, close (with/without publicity), below the threshold...
- ★ Centralised tender.
- ★ Ordinary, urgent, emergency.
- \star Tender > Award > Contract (be careful with the price).
- ★ Technical and administrative documentation.
- ★ Amendments.



(Procurement data is ugly, very ugly.)

Prepare for the worst.



And Big Pharma is particularly opaque.

(The devil is in the details.)

Take a look at the fine print.






Numbers that don't fit

Some countries pay for their vaccines more than others with higher incomes. The opacity in the sector hides the cost for governments and prevents them from demanding

better prices





Price? What price?



Spanish public hospitals pay 307,200 euros for each personalised childhood leukaemia treatment

The real cost that public administrations pay for CAR-T therapies is negotiated in secret, although the Ministry of Health does publish the maximum price it is willing

to pay.



In euros and per 12 weeks treatment. We have included only those countries for which we have official figures. Methodology



Extra: use red flags!

Clues to help you know where to look



Some basic red flags

- \star A lot of small contracts to the same company
- \bigstar Short deadlines (who is in a hurry?)
- ★ Only one tender (always)
- ★ Different prices for the exact same thing
- ★ Amendments
- ★ Opacity why are they hiding it?
- \star A small group of companies sharing the cake (cartel, anyone?)
