

How to overcome bias?

#Acknowledge and learn about your bias.



- There is no "view from nowhere".
- No, we are not 100% neutral, objective and impartial observers of events.
- Fact-based reporting still requires a selection and interpretation of facts.
- How biased are you? Take a test: https:// implicit.harvard.edu/implicit/takeatest.html

How to overcome bias?

#Investigate beyond the binary.



- Journalism is deeply shaped by binary thinking, it can affect the selection of story angles, protagonists and sources.
- Expect reality to have more than "both sides of a story".
- E.g., the developing vs. the developed world, good vs. evil, Western vs. Non-Western, rich vs. poor etc. might no longer (or never has) adequately reflected complex global realities.

How to overcome bias?

#Collaborate across borders.



- International cross-border teams are a great way to find out about your own blind spots as a journalist and helps to challenge single narratives.
- E.g. "Technology will save the world", "the global poor are natural innovators" common narratives that focus on technology (rather than holding governments or communities accountable or able) to improve peoples' lives.
