The EU lobby transparency register

- Biggest lobby register in the world
- You can find information on:

1)Money spent on lobbying 2)Numbers of lobbyists (lobbying employees and EP badges) 3)Topics lobbied on 4)Meetings with commissioners, cabinets, directors-general (not all Commission lobby meetings)

 Anyone lobbying or trying to influence EU decision-making should register

That sounds great! But...

The EU lobby register data is not perfect

- voluntary
 - not legally-binding
- sanctions are weak

This means that:

- There is some lobbying going on in Brussels which is **not captured** by the register.
- There is some unreliable or implausible data.

*All data is self-declared (except for EP badges and Commission lobby meetings)

- MCC Brussels, a far-right 'think tank', fails to disclose financial information, including its funding sources and operated without being registered in the transparency register.
- It recently co-hosted far-right propaganda events at the European Parliament, attacking 'gender ideology' and civil society.
- CEO complained to the EU transparency register Secretariat and they opened an investigation.





Despite the imperfect data, you can still find some good stories

An investigation by the EU Transparency Register has revealed that Amazon Europe updated its lobbying spending figures to over €5 million back in August. The new figures were published after a civil society complaint exposed two think tanks and two lobbies on the US multinational's payroll that were not properly registered.




LobbyFacts is a database co-hosted by CEO & LobbyControl that allows journalists, researchers, and activists to search, sort, filter, and analyse data from the official EU Transparency Register, tracking lobbyists and their influence at the EU level over time.


- LobbyFacts takes the data from the EU lobby register and makes it more user-friendly
- LobbyFacts does not change the data but does do simple 'curation'
- LobbyFacts presents EU lobby data from 2012
- Different search functions
- Fully downloadable data

*LobbyFacts synchronises with the EU lobby register once a day but ... lobbyists often only update registrations annually

HIGHEST DECLARING SECTORS





In a nutshell

With LobbyFacts you can:

- Look at declared lobby footprints from today and the past
- Explore an individual lobbyist's career moves
- Investigate clients of lobby and law firms
- Research lobbying on a specific topic or file
- Analyse lobby organisations from a specific country
- Avoid dodgy or implausible data

For most effective searches

- Make sure your search term is correctly spelled
- Watch out for unexpected issues in organisation names eg. it is ExxonMobil and not Exxon Mobil; also, it is JPMorgan and not JP Morgan
- Try searching for the full name as well as the acronym of an organisation if it does not show up immediately
- If you want to find the biggest or most active lobbies, use the filters (registrants) with/without a Brussels office; with/without European Parliament access passes; or those who have/have not held high-level meetings with the European Commission) on the <u>Search</u> and 'Get started' page.

For most effective searches

- To search for a particular lobby topic, try all relevant terms and acronyms. For example some registrants may refer to "Green Deal", "European Green Deal", "EGD", other variations, or individual elements of the Green Deal. Others may just make vague references to 'climate'.
- Try using " if you are searching for a phrase rather than single word ie. "digital market"


Please note that LobbyFacts is only as good as the data on the official register and there is little consistency in how registrants provide information on, for example, the issues they lobby on.
